
Rector's Message

2020 Highlights

WORSHIP

- Experienced strong in-person Sunday morning attendance for the first two and a half months of the year until shutdown.
- Pre-recorded and produced Sunday liturgies from mid-March through mid-July. In cooperation with the communications team, these pre-recorded services were sent out to the congregation via email each week and uploaded to the All Saints YouTube account.
- Celebrated a completely virtual Holy Week with Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Great Vigil of Easter all offered via Zoom. Over 80 households joined in for each online service.
- Experienced Fr. Ed's creative sermon recordings from various sites, including a visit to Elvis the donkey, for Palm Sunday.
- Began livestreaming Sunday services successfully from the Nave in mid-July.
- Offered 40+ "Family Table Service Offerings" on YouTube (avg. views = 93). 40+ families have read and recorded our Family Table Prayers of the People.
- In cooperation with the parish verger, David Reeve, and the safety coordinator, Phillip Fought, developed and implemented procedures for safe in-person worship during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Began limited in-person worship on our patronal Feast of All Saints Day (November 1, 2020).

MUSIC

- The Director of Music, Peter Crisafulli, developed creative use of music for worship in the absence of choir and congregational singing, creating many new arrangements and compositions, and developing the Offertory Hymn Meditation.
- The Director of Music continued to lead Zoom Evening Prayer and Compline services for the choir, as well as recording music to share with the All Saints community via the Daily Moment with God.



FELLOWSHIP & CONNECTION

- Enjoyed our pre-pandemic, in-person Pancake Supper, hosted by our Student Ministry.
- Launched three community groups via Zoom.
- Connected with each other in creative and intentional ways during quarantine through telephone calls, written notes and letters, Zoom, and even meal deliveries left on porches.




Family Ministry

2020 Highlights

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

- Transitioned from in-person Sunday school and Kids' Church to our Sunday morning Zoom classes which were attended by a solid group of regular students.
- Produced lessons and videos for All Saints Preschool teachers to use each week in class and also created materials to complement the summer take-home program. Hosted family chapels via Zoom for the students and their families to participate in at home.

STUDENT MINISTRY

- Transitioned smoothly to Zoom in March and found new and fun ways to keep our students engaged during the thick of guarantine.
- Began new small groups in the spring that continued throughout the year.

FAMILY MINISTRY

- Continued to foster connections through the in-person delivery of seasonal gifts by Family Ministry staff and volunteers.
- Produced a joyful Advent Festival in December via Zoom.
- Continued to offer, via Zoom, sacramental preparation for families and godparents of baptismal candidates.
- Transitioned youth confirmation classes to Zoom.
- Produced a ten-week "Kingdom Relationship" series via Zoom and YouTube featuring interviews with Father Ed, Sr. Warden Cindy Wade, vestryman Tony D'Emidio, Little Lights Exxecutive Director (and leaders of "Race Literacy 101" course) Steve Park, along with sections of sermons on "Kingdom" from Pastor Tony Evans. Each class had a Q&A component. Thursday evening attendance was between 15 and 30 people. Views on the sessions we uploaded to YouTube ranged from 30 - 160+.

2020 Highlights

- Successfully moved all formation opportunities into the digital sphere. Numbers of participants remained steady for all offerings.
- Offered a study on the Acts of the Apostles from March through June, averaging 14 participants.
- Offered a study on the Confessions of St. Augustine from June through September, averaging 17 participants.
- Ran three Bible sprints on Sundays from summer through late fall, averaging 25 participants (though often blessed with more!).
- Offered, during Advent, a Sunday course that explored Art and the liturgical season and held an evening retreat on the gifts of Christmas and Narnia which ran for three weeks leading up to Christmas Eve.
- A book club gathered for three monthly sessions to explore texts related to the Christian faith and life more broadly.
- Completely planned a pilgrimage to the Holy Land--while the pilgrimage could not safely take place, the materials remain available for future use.
- Launced the All Saints Podcast ministry, headed by Hugh Cole.
- Began a daily online devotional, Daily Moment with God, written by ASC staff and parishioners and read by 300+ people daily.

2020 Highlights

PRAYER TEAM

- Held four prayer vigils with attendance at over 35 for each one.
- Began Morning and Evening Prayer via Zoom on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- Provided a team-written booklet for intensive prayer for the 14 days leading up to Easter.
- Sent prayer cards to 684 parishioners indicating that they had been prayed for individually by a member of the prayer team.
- Held healing prayer training seminar for prayer team members.
- Offered adult formation opportunities: Alpha Prayer Course, Praying through the Psalms.
- Offered GriefShare, Gospel-centered support for those suffering loss.

VISITING MINISTRY

- Made 1,800+ contacts via email, phone call, or in-person visit (pre-Covid).
- Contacted every parishioner over 65 in March.
- Contacted every parishioner over 75 in October.
- Took meals to 12+ parishioners who were in need.
- Delivered 30 poinsettias to shut-ins.
- Sent cards to shut-ins and elderly parishioners (80 at Easter, 80 at Christmas).
- Sent flowers to grieving families.
- Grew Visitation Team membership to 23.



Mission and Outreach

2020 Highlights

LOCAL MISSION

- Provided 40 families with a turkey meal for Thanksgiving and provided 50 families with a turkey meal for Christmas, through Little Lights and the Share program.
- Provided groceries for 300+ families in Southeast DC.
- Participated in a virtual Angel Tree and provided gifts for the 50 children assigned to our parish.
- Gave grocery gift cards at the end of the year to our Blessing Bag recipients.
- Participated in the Race Literacy 101 course offered via Zoom by Little Lights. Fifteen parishioners took part in this ongoing effort to move forward with learning about Kingdom Relationships.
- Delivered to the ladies at the Rockville Women's Shelter a Christmas meal with all the trimmings, along with 35 wonderful gift bags with all kinds of thoughtful gifts provided by one of our women's Bible studies.
- Donated 50+ new coats shipped to Little Lights to help keep children and adults in the Potomac Gardens and Hopkins housing projects warm.

GLOBAL MISSION

- Added Rev. Bisoke and the Peace Center in the Congo to our budget.
- Maintained contact with partners in the Dominican Republic, Rwanda, and Uganda.
- Sent covid-specific funds to help our global partners.
- Co-hosted with Gary Wieder, a Zoom session with Dr. Sylvia from the Dominican Republic on Shrove Tuesday after the Pancake Supper.


Does she have a place to sleep at night? Does she have a family to love her? How can I help her?



2020 Highlights


- Sponsored our most successful auction in February 2020 at Columbia Country Club.

Financials and Notes

Overview of the financial year for program, kingdom and preschool



The COVID-19 virus had a profound impact on all aspects of the Parish and Church life and impacted financial operations in numerous ways both positively and negatively. The Vestry and finance staff tried to mitigate the shutdown by implementing a zero-based budget, applying for the Payroll Protection Program loan and analyzing the cost-benefit of operating the Preschool during the fall of 2020. Significant highlights that were a direct result of the COVID-19 virus included:

Positive COVID-19 Financial Highlights

- **Generosity of Parishioners** in our Easter and Christmas Match Campaigns that enabled us to sustain operations
- **Zero-Based budget -**that allowed us to cut church operating expenses by 10%
- Securing a First Round PPP Loan- that enabled us to keep all staff employed during the shutdown- which was forgiven in full during first quarter of 202 l
- **Increased spending on local outreach-** in particular the SHARE Boxes to feed the areas homeless program
- **Expenditures unique to COVID -** That allowed us to provide services from afar including equipment and infrastructure to provide Live-Stream Services and Zoom Small Group Meetings

Negative COVID-19 Financial Highlights

- An Approximate 15% reduction in total church giving— and in particular a 78% drop in loose cash / plate cash donations
- Reduced capacity- in the number of students the Preschool could enroll resulting in lower than normal tuition and fees
- **Expenditures unique to COVID**-including increased supply expense for cleaning and disinfection supplies, mask and janitorial cost

Stewardship & Financial Highlights

Stewardship- <u>Luke 6:38</u> Give, and it will be given to you. In good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, it will be put into your lap. For with the measure you use it will be measured back to you.

Even though 2020 has held tremendous challenges for all of us we do not take the sacrificial giving of our people in times of difficulty lightly. In a year filled with uncertainty, lockdowns, and unrest we were blessed that through your contributions including two special holiday campaigns at Easter and Christmas., we were able to sustain operations, fund our program ministries and help spread the word of Christ

While our church has remained strong and financially stable due to the efforts of your contributions we have faced many financial challenges throughout the year including a reduction in pledges fulfilled for 2020 and a reduction in both the number and amount of pledges in the annual pledge campaign.

Pledged Giving comprised between 60-75% of the Church's overall revenues in any giving year. Your pledges allow financial management to budget appropriately for the programming year.

Every aspect of church life is impacted by your generosity. Through pledged giving and holiday giving we are able to fund operational and fixed expenses such as utilities and lawn and garden upkeep to funding and growing our program ministries.

Stewardship & Financial Highlights

Finance- 1 Timothy 6:18 Instruct them to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous and ready to share

Total Church giving was down 15% and total revenue from all sources including Kingdom Campaign and Preschool was down 27% in 2020 as compared to the year ending 2019. The shutdown of services combined with overall economic uncertainty and reduced capacity in the preschool all were contributing factors for the substantial decrease. Expenses were tightly controlled over the course of the year and spending was limited to ensuring that program ministries could continue in a virtual setting and in providing for the safety and security of our staff, children and parish. Church operating expenses were cut by 10% and overall spending from all sources including Kingdom Campaign and Preschool were reduced by 4%.

Church Program Expenditures Highlights



Gather program expenses cover the operations of all ministries involving the active worship and gathering of the congregation. Traditionally program expenses include supporting Nave and Family Table worship services as well as the flower and alter guilds and Sunday lunches and coffee hours. In 2020 the focus turned to how to provide a meaningful worship experience in a virtual setting. Major expenditures for the 2020 program year for Gather Ministries included:

- Funding of Live Stream Equipment
- Updating Nave infrastructure for wiring sound for virtual services
- Providing hand sanitizer stations and mask for in-person worship
- Updating software to handle inperson registrations





The Grow program covers expenses as the relate to family, men's, women's, youth and children's ministry. Prior years expenses have funded youth trips, retreats, vacation bible school as well as Sunday school and weekday worship opportunities. In 2020, however the expenses were focused on how to bring programing to families, youth and children under quarantine. Program expenses in 2020 were used to fund:

- Updated Software to provide online opportunities including bible studies, small groups and youth groups
- Supplies, time and talent expenses to produce weekly online Sunday school for children's ministry



GO ministries provides programming for global and local outreach as well as pastoral care. 2020 saw an increased need for all aspects of the GO program. Expenses were expanded in order to fund contributions to our outreach partners as well as to take care of the parishes pastoral needs. Critical program expenses for the year included:



- Expanded Blessing Bags and SHARE food boxes for Little Lights Partners
- Additional support for our partners in the CONGO
- Flowers, notes and cards for parishioners whom an in-person visit was no longer possible


