


FROM THE SENIOR WARDEN

It has been a true honor and privilege serving on Vestry and as your Senior Warden. The world has obviously changed a great deal since I accepted the call in 2019. But one thing will never change: God's love, grace, and mercy for us! Our Vestry and parish continue to be guided by our 2020-24 Strategic Plan, and our 3-part mission to share Christ's love, transform lives, and build God's Kingdom. In this annual report, you'll see how we've strengthened our Biblical foundation, and expanded our mission & outreach and student ministries. We've also strengthened our financial leadership, management, and governance. And, we've grown more united as a Kingdom people, to help heal the myriad divisions in this world.



2021 was also a year of transition. We bid farewell to our beloved Rector, Fr. Ed Kelaher, and his wife Patty, who blessed us with a remarkable period of stability, renewal, and growth. In September, we launched the search for a new rector who lives and conveys their abiding faith in Jesus Christ. We are seeking a person of faith, maturity, and demonstrated accomplishment, well-versed in scripture and preaching the Gospel, with strong leadership abilities and vision. Our goal has been to discern the person that God has already chosen for us. We gathered input from more than 100 parishioners, staff, and clergy, and engaged with more than a dozen candidates. Our fervent prayer and hope is to have a new rector in place by Fall 2022. In the coming months, we will see if that is God's will.

To be sure, challenges remain. Families continue to be affected by the pandemic. We see suffering throughout the world. Divisions remain both within and outside our parish. Giving remains below pre-pandemic levels, and the parish continues to operate at a deficit. Over the past two years, we've been regularly reminded that we are not in control. This is God's plan, not our own. We are comforted that His plan is to give us a future and a hope! (Jeremiah 29:11) Finally, I am grateful for the service of our clergy, staff, Vestry, and lay leaders – particularly Father BJ, Father Matthew, and Lois McDonald. This annual report is a testament to their faith, endurance, and leadership. Thanks be to them – and thanks be to God, for everything He is doing through them.





From the Junior Warden

The Buildings and Grounds Committee, for which the Junior Warden is responsible, began a new phase in managing our 120-year-old Church in 2022. In calendar year 2021, the Buildings and Grounds Committee was in a mode of only managing non-discretionary projects. These projects represented work to repair water leaks, minor flooding, and operational infrastructure failures. No prioritized improvements were taken on during the 2021 year due to the COVID pandemic.

Many of the 2021 projects repaired water leaks where the stone structure of our Church meets newer structures, and minor flooding related to the stream running underground our buildings. All non-discretionary work was acted upon, and our Church is in solid shape thanks to the diligence of our Facilities Manager Bill Garner.

One important activity the Junior Warden led in the latter half of 2021 was the launch of the long-awaited Organ Renovation project. The Kingdom Campaign raised funds specifically for this project, which is being spearheaded by our brilliant Peter Crisafulli. The work began in early winter and will be performed by Lewis & Hitchcock with the organ expected to be inoperable for 2-3 months beginning after Easter 2022.

At the end of 2021, the Buildings and Grounds Committee received a request by the Vestry to prioritize discretionary work to begin in 2022. This discretionary work will be funded by a separate non-operating source only to be used for capital improvements. The prioritization of these projects is complete, and many are now underway.

We enjoyed the return of both the Fall Festival and the Parish Advent Festival. We have also celebrated dozens of Baptisms, funerals, and a few weddings. 

GATHER - MUSIC MINISTRY

As 2021 began with continuing restrictions due to COVID, the Minister of Music provided most of the service music - serving as both organist and cantor, and occasionally adding a few extra musicians for special services. The choir continued to meet virtually for Evening Prayer, Compline, and "checking-in", but rehearsing was not possible.

However, as the year progressed, things began looking up:

- The long-awaited return of the choir began in July.
- Weekly Thursday night choir rehearsals resumed after Labor Day.
- A new composition, "At the Name of Jesus," written in honor of Fr. Ed's ministry at All Saints, was premiered at his farewell service September 12th.
- Another new composition, "We walk by faith," was performed by the choir for services during the fall stewardship campaign.
- We were able to once again have Advent & Christmas Lessons & Carols services.
- The Music Ministry sponsored a well-attended live holiday concert by Flutes-on-the-Brink.
- The choir was in full force for the Christmas services, as was the *All Saints Nativity Brass*.
- Design details for the renewal of the organ were refined and finalized.
- The Minister of Music continued making regular contributions to the "Daily Moment with God" meditations.
- Kate Reeve played a vital role in helping singers regain vocal health and skills following the choir's 18-month hiatus.

2021 was a good - but challenging - year for Family Ministry, which includes oversight of the Family Table Service, Children's Ministry, Student Ministry, and more. While maintaining most of our programs in some form, we also saw an increased need for pastoral care for our parishioners. The pandemic has taken its toll, not just physically, but also spiritually and emotionally. We serve "people over programs" and our team has done it's best to counsel, support, and care for parishioners of all ages. Thank you to everyone who has put others before themselves and cared for someone else during this time. Some highlights of Family Ministry in 2021:



Volunteers

Our volunteers – especially the leaders and teachers for Children's Ministry and Student Ministry – continued to positively impact our younger parishioners. They are the unsung heroes of Family Ministry. We have over 20 faithful volunteers leading Sunday morning education classes. Thank you!



Family Table Service

The Family Table Service (almost 3 ½ years old now!) is worshipping in the Great Hall again after several months of outdoor services and socially-distanced Saturday evenings services. We have many new families – even with the earlier time (8:30 a.m.) and some cold mornings! Worship is alive and engaging. Some 25+ families serve by reading scripture or prayers and by greeting others.

Bible Studies

In 2021, a few small group Bible studies continued to meet and feed one another with God's Word. These groups not only dig into the Bible, they also pray for each other and show up at important times in each other's lives. It has been inspiring to see how they minister to one another through life's ups and downs.

Festivals

We celebrated the return of the outdoor Fall Festival in October and a festive Advent Festival in December. These are always great fellowship opportunities – ever more needed during these past couple years.

Counseling

Pre-marital counseling continues to be a valuable part of our ongoing ministries to families; four couples went through marriage prep sessions.

As we move forward, we look to expand our intergenerational worship, discipleship, and fellowship opportunities at All Saints Church and beyond.

STUDENT MINISTRY - THRIVING AND GROWING!


2021 was both a challenging and rewarding year for Student Ministry. Because we rely heavily on relational ministry, we faced significant barriers with mostly virtual events for the first half of the year. Our virtual ministry pivoted often and evolved to meet the increased needs of our students as they went through a difficult and often lonely season. The return to in-person programming in the Fall brought countless blessings. With weekly meetings and monthly events, our students continue to grow closer to each other; they look forward to seeing their friends each week to fellowship, play games, and hear the Gospel. There is a real feeling of community when we are together, and we ask for prayers that this continues to grow into 2022.



- 70 Sunday Morning meetings for CLUB (High School) and CREW (middle school), with 19 new students attending one or more SM events.
- 7 events, including 2 Park Picnics, Laser Tag with 26 kids, the Fall Festival, the Trampoline Park with 11 Middle Schoolers, the Angel Tree Project (gifts for 9 kids of incarcerated adults), and one middle school Parents' Dinner.
- 8 "Days of Service" Events, including Summer Lights (a week-long service program at Little Lights), 2 Little Lights service days in the Fall, Thanksgiving Blessing Boxes, and the Student Ministry Angel Tree Project.
- One in-person Confirmation Class, with 18 students confirmed.
- A new High School girls small group formed, with 6 girls regularly attending.

Adult Formation



- Multiple Sunday morning classes offered, including the God, Kings, and Israel Bible Sprint, Jesus's Healing Miracles, Prophecies Pointing to Christ, Questions of Faith in Early Christian Art.
- Continued faithful attendance at the Wednesday evening Bible Study.
- Other weekly studies began or continued, both in-person and via Zoom.

MEN'S MINISTRY

- Men's Fall Workday to fix sod, install pavers, and landscape.
- The start of a new Men's Group called "Men of Virtue" which meets every Wednesday on Zoom. Quote:

WOMEN'S MINISTRY



- The Wednesday morning Women's Bible Study, led by All Saints clergy, studied Pauls' epistles.
- The Chevy Chase Women's Bible Study on Thursdays studied The Kingdom is Near: A New Day is Dawning (Making Space for God Bible Study) and Diana Schick's Secrets of Unshakeable Faith: Studies from Peter 1 & 2.
- We resumed Ladies' Night Out in the fall last year. These monthly gatherings, at the home of a parishioner, feature a woman of the parish sharing her story of life with Jesus. These were well attended, with great fellowship, meaningful conversations, and women in all seasons of life finding common ground and learning to appreciate the sweet grace of the Lord.
- In addition to growing in the Word of God, and in their individual relationships with the Lord, the ladies of All Saints ministered to those at the *Interfaith Works Women's Center*, a shelter for women experiencing homelessness in Rockville, MD, by providing meals and special Christmas gifts. These gifts let the women know that they are thought of and are loved by All Saints and that they are loved by our Savior Jesus Christ.

The mission of All Saints Preschool – a ministry of All Saints Church - is to instill the joy of learning in a nurturing environment that reflects God's love. Our warm and engaging teachers and staff work diligently to make sure each child grows, develops, and masters skills at their own pace. Our nine core values are woven into all that we do – Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self-Control. We are extremely grateful to the dedicated and highly qualified staff who have worked tirelessly and faithfully in providing a program of excellence for the children of ASP.

One special highlight this year: ASP received the long-awaited new Child Development Program License (two days before Winter Break) for increased capacity. We have since opened two new classrooms serving our youngest learners ages 1-2 years old. This school year has been the most successful year since the school's inception in 2009! From our parents:

OVERVIEW

You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself. Luke 10:27-28

We praise the Lord that not even a pandemic can diminish the ways in which we love God and our neighbor! 2021 saw us flourish in many ways, but especially in our GO ministries – pastoral care (in-reach to our own parishioners) as well as "out-reach" to others near and far. Our pastoral care ministries – especially the Prayer Team and the Visiting Ministries, were active last year, serving and praying with and for parishioners, visiting, calling, sending cards, or emailing those who were injured, ill, home-bound or bereaved. Praise the Lord for his everlasting love and new mercies! Locally, we partnered with other organizations to address food insecurity in our community and to help refugee families who have recently resettled here. We supported women in a local shelter, hosted international students at Thanksgiving, and shared Christ's love through gifts and meals during the holidays. And we hosted much-needed blood drives with the American Red Cross to help save lives. Globally, our congregation was able to send funds to ministry partners serving the poor and marginalized in Rwanda, Uganda, the Congo, and the Dominican Republic. We pray for a return to our "normal" total attendance of 300-400 people per Sunday.

WELCOME TEAM

Once we resumed meeting in person, All Saints greeters filled the important role of creating a warm and welcoming atmosphere for those returning on Sunday mornings, as well as for visitors to our parish. In addition to extending hospitality to all, greeters provide information about the church, and help people get to where they need to go, whether a class, service, or for coffee & fellowship. The Welcome Team plays a huge role in connecting us and will continue to do so as we emerge from the pandemic.



VISITING MINISTRY

The mission of the Visiting Ministry is to reach out as Jesus' disciples to fellow parishioners to ensure that each person among us is known, loved, and cared for. This is especially true for those who cannot get out, either temporarily or for longer periods. We are all about relationships. Visiting Ministers are fulfilled by reaching out to others, and receive back as much as those who are visited. Often, over time, Visiting Ministers get very close to the ones they visit. One parishioner recently said:

"The Visiting Ministry phone calls, flowers, and notes make me feel the love and warmth of the All Saints' family even when I cannot be an active member. In particular, I thank them with all my heart for the attention they gave to me after my recent surgery."

In 2021, the Visiting Ministry:

- Made approximately 2,650 contacts, which included visiting, calling, and sending cards and emails to parishioners who were ill, injured, grieving, or shut-in;
- Delivered several flower arrangements each week and took Eucharist to parishioners who requested it;
- Set up weekly meal plans and took dinners to parishioners needing assistance;
- Provided approximately 215 rides to church or other locations;
- Called Parishioners on their birthday and called approximately 90 parishioners who were 80 years old and older to inquire about their well-being during COVID;
- Sent approximately 75 Easter and 80 Christmas cards to ill, injured, grieving, and shut-in parishioners; and
- Delivered 30 poinsettias in December.

- Prayer Cards sent to every active family twice during the year, and
- All Saints Active Prayer Team (ASAP) praying for every ministry at the church.

Some recent quotes:

We often pray for my patients, with their consent of course, and three times in the last two months prayers have been answered to the theme of God will make a way where there seems to be no way. Most recently, I learned that the woman found by her husband unresponsive and in the ICU on life support is now home as if nothing happened! He thanked us for our prayers when I saw him...yesterday!

Thanks be to God that we have been blessed so that we can share our blessings with others! Some highlights for 2021:



Interfaith Works Women's Shelter in Rockville
Despite pandemic restrictions that prevented us from physically engaging with the ladies who reside at the shelter, ASC parishioners:

- Helped provide a week of healthy breakfast options and dinners to the 70 residents of the shelter.
- The ladies of All Saints put together Christmas gift bags for the residents, who were blessed that someone remembered them and took the time to make them feel special.








- Helped alleviate food insecurity by donating fresh produce and meat through the SHARE program from Catholic Charities. Each box fed a family of four for a week.
- At Thanksgiving, donated enough to make 105 Thanksgiving Meal Kits, feeding more than 400 individuals.
- Monthly "Saturday Serve Days", bringing sack lunches to help keep kids safe and engaged in fun activities on the weekends.
- High School students served at "Summer Lights" a week-long VBStype summer program; ASC students became camp counselors for children in the Little Lights community, sharing Christ's love by spending time, learning, and playing games together.
- Donated new coats and winter jackets to the Little Lights "Toy Store" so that parents could shop for coats and toys to give their children for Christmas.
- In our on-going pursuit of kingdom relationship-building, dozens of clergy, staff, and parishioners attended Little Light's Race Literacy 101 course.

Refugee Care

- in partnership with Lutheran Social Services
- Held a drive for household items, including new kitchen, bathroom, bedroom, and other basics that were delivered to a central site where newly arrived families could "shop" for necessities to help set up their new homes.
- Donated gift cards totalling approximately \$2,500 to recently displaced families to shop for themselves, maintaining their dignity and agency over what they wear, eat, etc.



Global Missions

Despite the severe travel restrictions due to the pandemic, All Saints Church remained engaged with our Global Mission Partners.

- We financially supported and prayed regularly for our global partners: Dr. Silvia in the Dominican Republic; Rev. Bisoke in the Congo; Bishop Deo and the Mustard Seed Project in Rwanda; and Richard and Catherine Ranger, ASC missionaries to Uganda.
- We held "Zoom Around the World", a series of four Sunday morning sessions connecting with our global partners, which enabled parishioners to hear directly from them and learn about the victories and challenges they face in their respective corners of the world.

2021 Highlights

Quarterly luncheons resumed last fall: more than 45 attended the October gathering which featured Father Matthew share about his faith journey. 



- Increasing awareness of parishioners of giving as a means of spiritual formation


