# INTERIM RECTOR'S MESSAGE

## Dear Parish Family,

As I look back on the past few years, I see God walking with us even in difficult times. In front of us, He led the way; behind us, He urged us forward; and beside us, He encouraged us in our labors. Even as we emerged from the pandemic, God never left us nor forsook us. Instead, He continued the good work He began in this parish many years ago. Focusing on just 2022, I am awed and humbled by what God did in us and through us. Here are just a few highlights:

- Average Sunday attendance grew from 180 in the spring to 248 in the Fall;
- The Family Table Service moved to 10:30, with an immediate uptick in attendance;
- The early service moved from 7:45 to 8:30 and grew both numerically and intergenerationally;
- The long-awaited organ refurbishment project was completed, and we have an organ that now sounds fantastic;
- For the first time since 2019, we held the Parish Retreat, in-person VBS, and the Christmas Pageant on Christmas Eve;
- The Acolyte ministry returned with new acolytes and adult leaders;
- Bread Coin became a new mission partner;
- Outreach to the Knollwood Retirement Center began; and
- The Vestry ended the year by passing a balanced budget for 2023.

Of course, we said, "Farewell" to Fr. Mac and Rev. Ruth as well as our student minister, but God has since raised up new clergy, leaders, seminarians, and volunteers to fill their shoes, and we are blessed by them all. God has been good to All Saints Church, and I, for one, am truly grateful. I hope that as you read more of the details and see all of the pictures within this annual report, you too will be inspired give God thanks and praise!

As we move into 2023, I pray that God's Holy Spirit will (a) draw us together into a tighter community where meaningful relationships are established and maintained; (b) lead more people to be engaged in prayer and Bible Studies; and (c) guide us to reach out to our neighbors with the Good News and love of Jesus. May we all continue to follow wherever He leads, urges, and encourages, and may He continue His great work here until our Lord returns.

## FROM THE JUNIOR WARDEN



The Junior Warden is responsible for All Saints Church's buildings and grounds via The Buildings and Grounds Committee, which manages our 121-year-old Church and two parish houses. In calendar year 2022, the Buildings and Grounds Committee was fortunate to be able to tap into investment funding for two very specific capital improvements.

One of these had been in the planning stages for years, that being the long-awaited Organ Renovation project. The Kingdom Campaign raised funds specifically for this project, which was spearheaded by our brilliant Peter Crisafulli. While work began in late 2021, the spring was when the fruits of the labor of organ renovation specialist Lewis & Hitchcock showed their glory with the beautiful renditions for Easter 2022. The spectrums of tonal beauty can be heard every Sunday since!

Also in 2022, our Communications Manager, Teri Ballou, led the charge with the new exterior Church signage project that was decades overdue. The elegant new signage truly does represent the youthful spirit of All Saints and shines on behalf of the vigor of, and an invitation to, new families joining our Parish.

As 2022 was drawing to a close, the Junior Warden led the planning for the Summer 2023 Great Hall renovation project which is fully funded by a contribution from Boy Scouts Troop 52 and specific investment funding set aside early in 2022.

Other 2022 minor projects repaired water leaks, minor infrastructure failures, and minor flooding related to the stream running underground our buildings. All non-discretionary work was acted upon, and our Church is in solid shape thanks to the diligence of our recently retired Facilities Manager Bill Garner and his replacement Phil Fought.

As we moved into 2023, the Vestry passed a balanced budget, and no new discretionary projects are planned. Your Buildings and Grounds are in good repair and ready for a bright future!

## OVERVIEW

## OVERVIEW

Calendar year 2022 saw increased growth for the ministries under GROW, blessing children, students, adults, and families of all sizes and seasons of life. Our Sunday morning education offered something for the whole family, with multiple classes offered during the year for adults, from the Christian basics; various Bible Studies; offerings on prayer, parenting, or Biblical history; and so much more.

Family Ministry continued to minister to all ages! There is much to give thanks for: pre-marital sessions, small group Bible studies, all-Parish events (Pancake Supper, Parish Retreat, and the Fall & Advent Festivals), the Christmas Pageant, and the list goes on. Thank you for making families an integral part of the fabric of our ASC community.

Children’s and Student ministries also saw increased participation in 2022, as compared to the previous two years, as did other Adult Formation activities during the week, with continuing parish Bible Studies, and small groups for both ladies and men.

It is such an encouraging part of our week to see a smiling, welcoming, intergenerational congregation coming together to worship.

There are many other positives to give thanks for: pre-marital sessions, small group Bible studies, Advent Festivals, Christmas Pageants (over 50 children participated!), Parenting Classes... the list goes on.





## GROW LEADERSHIP - LAY

Our Children's Ministry Sunday School program pressed on with three separate classes plus a fully staffed nursery. Pre-K and Kindergarten launched the new Godly Play program. The 1st and 2nd grade class and the 3rd and 4th grade classes explored Biblical themes and stories such as John the Baptist, The Ten Commandments, The Christmas Story, parables, etc., reaching approximately 75 children, with 30-50 each Sunday.

Other children's ministry events included the Christmas Pageant, VBS, kids time during worship, First Communion classes, and Baptism Prep, all together reaching well over 100 children throughout the course of the year. As always, thank you to our faithful volunteers, teachers and parents who made the whole process smooth and successful.

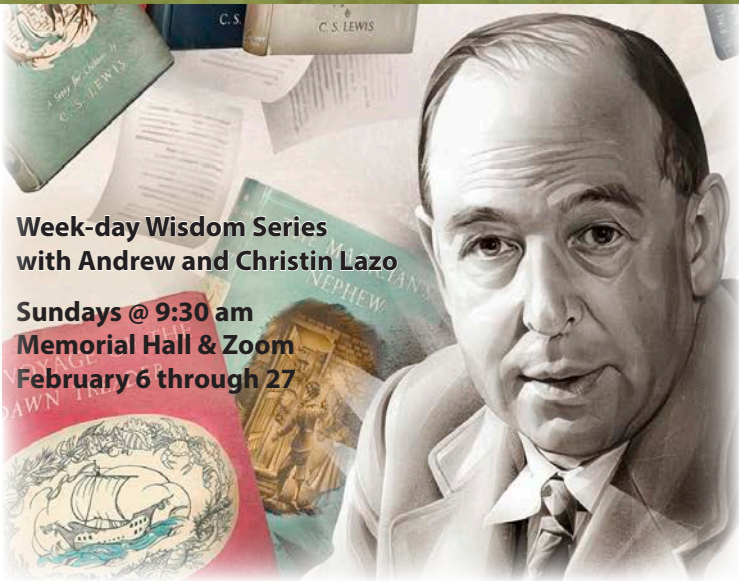

## OVERVIEW

Praise God for blessing the “GO” ministries of All Saints Church in 2022! Thanks to your generosity with finances and time, All Saints remained a **church on mission**, growing in our love for the Lord, and sharing His love with our neighbors, near and far! The GO ministries include the Welcome Team and Pastoral Care ministries - such as the Prayer Team and Visiting Ministries - “in-reach” to our own parishioners who are infirm, homebound, and those in need.

GO also includes Global and Local Missions – “out-reach” to neighbors in our backyard and around the world. Globally, we partner with like-minded brothers and sisters in Christ who address widespread hunger, poverty, and illness by providing basic resources and the Gospel of Christ, all made possible by funds we send them throughout the year.

Local Missions at All Saints Church aims to serve marginalized groups who are our neighbors by partnering with other local ministries, playing with their kids, volunteering as camp counselors (such as with Summer Lights), serving meals, spending time with them over coffee and making a craft together, repairing closets (All Saints Men’s Ministry volunteering at the Women’s Shelter), and giving generously to help with basic needs. Last year we boldly embarked on a new partnership with a military retirement community, Knollwood – a mere 8 minutes away from the church (see box.) We were so excited about meeting this new ministry that we invited Margie (the lynchpin!) to be the keynote speaker at our Ladies Night Out event in December. What a lovely way to welcome our new friends to All Saints! Praise God for 2022!

Globally, our congregation joyfully wired promised funds to mission partners serving the poor and marginalized in **Rwanda, Uganda, the Congo, and the Dominican Republic**. Additionally, we enjoyed an in-person visit from our very own **Richard and Catherine Ranger**, missionaries serving the students at **Uganda Christian University**. Due to travel restrictions, and thanks to Zoom, we stayed in touch with our remaining global partners during our annual Sunday morning **Zoom Around the World** sessions. This gave our parishioners an opportunity to reacquaint themselves with our mission partners around the world.

Locally, All Saints Church continued to love our neighbors by serving children and their families through **Little Lights** in SE DC. Our faithful volunteers also served the ladies at the **Interfaith Works Women's Center** in Rockville every month, doing crafts, serving meals, and getting to know them over coffee. In the Fall and Winter of 2022, our congregation enthusiastically participated in packing 120 Thanksgiving Meal Kits that we distributed to the families we have gotten to know through Little Lights. This same community were the recipients of our annual New Coat/Winter Wear drive in December. The 2022 holiday season saw the All Saints Church family pour out the love of Jesus through the Angel Tree Project, where our families provide gifts for the children of incarcerated individuals in our area. Our Women's ministry ladies collaborated to put together wonderful Christmas gifts for the ladies at the Women's Center. A group of volunteers distributed those gifts after singing carols, and serving a delicious meal.

Last Fall, we also entered into a new partnership with **Breadcoin**, an organization that empowers the underserved in DC by providing a dignified way for them to access meals, while supporting local businesses in the community. *We have much to celebrate and give thanks to God for, but above all, we are in awe of how the Lord is most definitely a God who hears us, and answers prayer in specific ways!*

**Knollwood - A Story of the Spirit Leading!**

Back in January 2022, I began to pray about effective ways to re-engage with our community after the pandemic. We needed something local and simple to execute, that would involve the community and would be intentional in sharing the Gospel of Jesus. A ministry resource that checked all the boxes was **Alpha**, a trusted multi-week small study that has been around for several decades. I prayed: *“Lord, please guide us if Alpha is in your plan for All Saints, and help us to identify where, when, and who we should serve.”*

Less than twelve hours later (!), I had an email from a stranger named Margie, a fellow Christ-follower who was a resident at **Knollwood** military retirement community 1.3 miles away, specifically requesting Alpha for her community! The clarity and speed with which the Lord answered that prayer still makes my head spin! Praise Jesus!

With the help of Margie, and her special crew of enthusiastic residents at Knollwood, we kicked off Alpha at the beginning of Lent in 2022, meeting on Wednesday nights. It was very easy to include dinner at the beginning as per the Alpha model, followed by the class. We had thirty residents who signed up and returned every week! Alpha was such a success that when we wrapped up the course, the sweet residents of Knollwood requested that we return with a Bible Study! Last year, apart from the Alpha course, and with the support of my fellow All Saints ministry leaders and clergy, we brought Bible Studies in Philippians, Colossians, Ephesians, and a special Advent study to our neighbors at Knollwood. What joy it is to serve a God who so clearly answered a simple prayer by calling All Saints Church to join with and serve a community right around the corner from us in Washington, D.C., adding Knollwood to our Local Mission field!

## VISITING MINISTRY

The mission of the Visiting Ministry is to ensure that each person among us is known, loved, and cared for, especially those who - either temporarily or for long periods - cannot get out to enjoy the church community.

Highlights of 2022:

- Made 1,900 contacts, through visits, calls, emails, and cards
- Delivered Eucharist to those unable to come to church
- Took 96 flower arrangements to parishioners
- Provided 150 rides to and from church
- Took poinsettias during Christmas season to ill, injured, and shut-in parishioners
- Sent 75 seasonal cards to ill, injured, grieving, and shut-in parishioners at both Christmas and at Easter



## PRAYER TEAM

The **Women of All Saints (WAS)** affords women of the parish the opportunity to gather for worship, service, and fellowship. Highlights of 2022:

- The quarterly luncheon and guest speaker programs drew more than 50 parishioners per event. A highlight of 2022 was the program in October, when Shireen David, ASC Director of Mission and Outreach, shared her incredible testimony as a Christian child raised in the Republic of India, later immigrating with her family to the United States.
- WAS also awards one or more high school seniors each year a scholarship toward further study. ASC high school seniors Hadley Sharp and Cecelia Wieder were the recipients of the 2022 WAS Youth Scholarship, each receiving \$2,000 towards their university tuition.
- Our Corresponding Secretary, Bonnie Barnes, sent 266 greeting cards and notes in 2022, including birthday, get well, sympathy, and Christmas greetings to ASC clergy, staff, and parishioners. The WAS Corresponding Outreach Program has proven very effective, and parishioners greatly appreciate being remembered.
- Already in its 70th year of operation, the ASC Thrift Shop is a vital place of fellowship and community service where its 25 volunteers - women from the parish and women from the surrounding community - share God's love to help provide for others. In FY 2022, \$24,500 in proceeds were donated to ASC ministries and outreach programs. And \$14,300 was awarded to 19 local and international ministries and charities focused primarily on women and children.

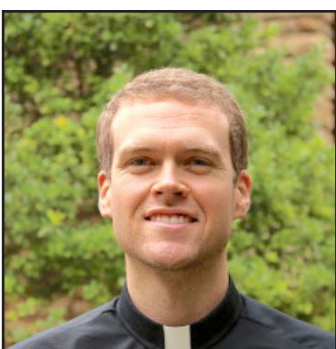
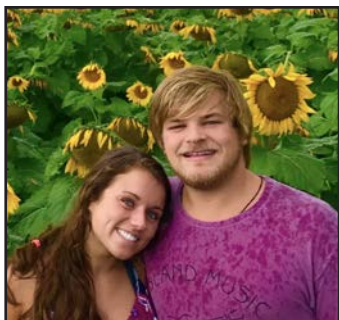

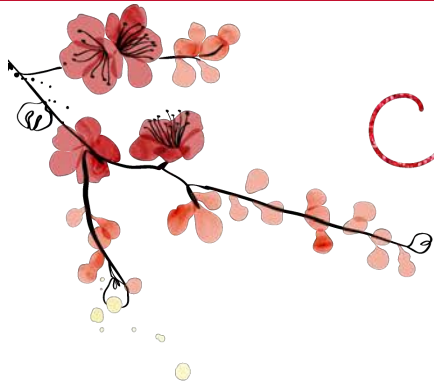

### Highlights:

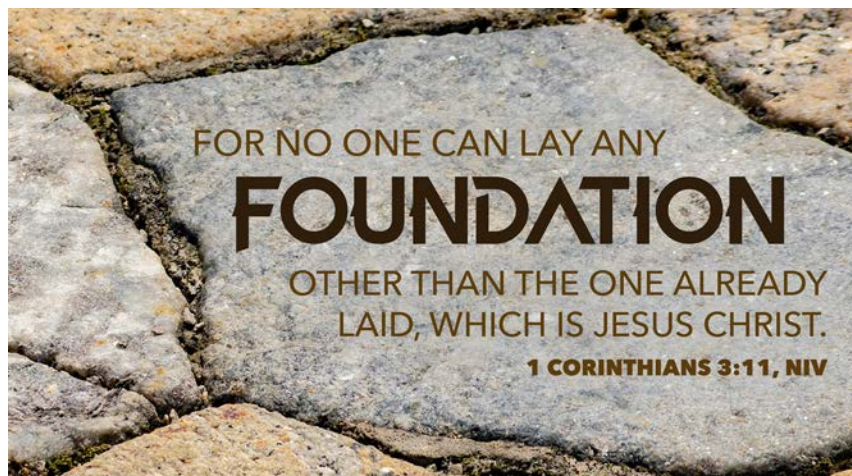
- Pledges up significantly from the previous year, with 231 total pledges in the amount of \$1,400,246.84 for the year 2023

### LOOKING AHEAD

During 2022, as we transitioned from the pandemic to a new normal in ministry (including in the financial area) we found that pledged giving was down, we were operating at a financial deficit, and our budgeting and accounting procedures needed improvement.
