## THE READING OF SCRIPTURE

### The First Lesson

*The congregation may be seated.*

*Malachi 3:1-4*

*Reader:* A reading from the Book Malachi.

See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight-- indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears?

For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years.

*Reader:* The Word of the Lord.

**All:** Thanks be to God.

## Sequence Hymn

## The Gospel

*Luke 3:1-6*

**Gospeller:** The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

**People:** **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah,

"The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

'Prepare the way of the Lord,  
make his paths straight.

Every valley shall be filled,  
and every mountain and hill shall be made low,

and the crooked shall be made straight,  
and the rough ways made smooth;

and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."

**Gospeller:** The Gospel of the Lord.

**People:** **Praise to you, Lord Christ.**

## Lighting of the Advent Wreath - Peace

*(As the Advent candle is lighted, the leader will explain its significance.)*

*Reader:* God kept his promise of a Savior who would be born in Bethlehem, the Prince of Peace. Help us to be ready to welcome YOU, O GOD! As it is written in the Psalms: "The LORD gives strength to his people; the LORD blesses his people with peace." May the peace of Christ rule in our hearts, since as members of one body we are called to peace.

*Reader:* Lord, you are the light of our world.

***People:* O come, O come, Emmanuel.**

*Reader:* O God of grace and promise, we await the fulfillment of your wondrous plan. Our King and Savior now draws near:  
Come let us adore him.

***People:* O come, O come, Emmanuel.**

*Reader:* May the light of your love always shine in our hearts.

***All:* Amen.**

# The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God,  
the Father, the Almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth,  
of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,  
the only Son of God,  
eternally begotten of the Father,  
God from God, Light from Light,  
true God from true God,  
begotten, not made,  
of one Being with the Father.  
Through him all things were made.  
For us and for our salvation  
he came down from heaven:  
by the power of the Holy Spirit  
he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary,  
and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;  
he suffered death and was buried.  
On the third day he rose again  
in accordance with the Scriptures;  
he ascended into heaven  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,  
and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,  
who proceeds from the Father and the Son.  
With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.  
He has spoken through the Prophets.  
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.  
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.  
We look for the resurrection of the dead,  
and the life of the world to come. Amen.

## Prayers of the People (Form III)

*Reader:* Father, we pray for your holy Catholic Church;

*People:* **That we all may be one.**

*Reader:* Grant that every member of the Church may truly and humbly serve you;

*People:* **That your Name may be glorified by all people.**

*Reader:* Bless, O Lord, our Local Outreach partners, especially the ministry you have given us at Knollwood. We pray for all who participate, that their lives will be changed.

*People:* **That they may be empowered to love the rejected and the outcasts as Jesus did.**

*Reader:* For all bishops, priests, and deacons, especially the Presiding Bishop; our Bishop; and All Saints' clergy, ministry leaders, and staff.

*People:* **That they may be faithful ministers of your Word and Sacraments.**

*Reader:* We continue to pray for peace in the Middle East, in Ukraine, in the Congo, and in all places of conflict throughout the world. May violent hearts be transformed so that Your Spirit of peace, hope, justice, and compassion would govern all people. We pray for all who govern and hold authority in the nations of the world;

*People:* **That there may be justice and peace on the earth.**

*Reader:* We continue to pray for our Annual Giving Campaign, that all parishioners will respond in faith and generosity to the blessings that you have given us. Give us grace to do your will in all that we undertake;

*People:* **That our works may find favor in your sight.**

*Reader:* Have compassion on those who suffer from any grief or trouble. We also pray for those whose names are on our hearts and minds, those who have been made known to us and are named in love and hope in our Parish Prayer List, and those who are known only to you;

*People:* **That they may be delivered from their distress.**



*Reader:* Give to the departed eternal rest, especially David Bradley, Marcia Railton, and Howard Lawler.

*People:* **Let light perpetual shine upon them.**

*Reader:* We praise you for your saints who have entered into joy;

*People:* **May we also come to share in your heavenly kingdom.**

*Reader:* Let us pray for our own needs and those of others.

*(The people may add their own petitions.)*

## Concluding Collect

*Celebrant:* Almighty and eternal God, ruler of all things in heaven and earth: Mercifully accept the prayers of your people, and strengthen us to do your will; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

## The Confession

*Celebrant:* Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

*(Silence may be kept.)*

*People:* **Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.**

*Celebrant:* Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**

*(Please stand)*
