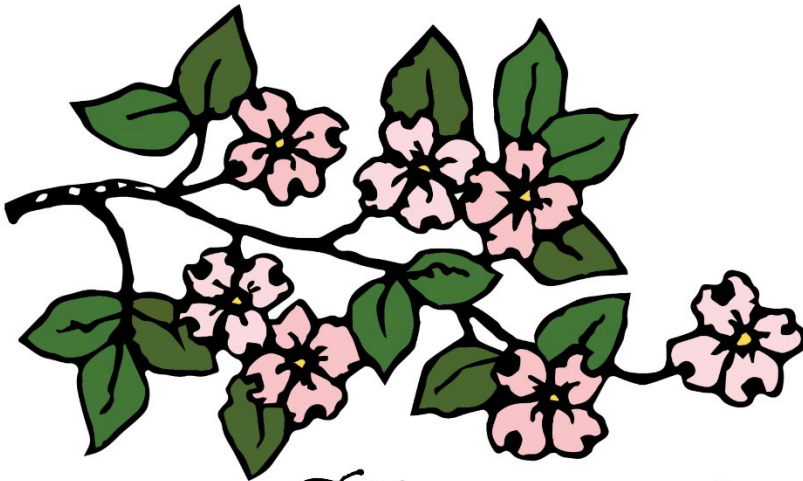

The Collect of the Day

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

***People:* And also with you.**

Celebrant: Let us pray.

O God, you have prepared for those who love you such good things as surpass our understanding: Pour into our hearts such love towards you, that we, loving you in all things and above all things, may obtain your promises, which exceed all that we can desire; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

The First Lesson

The congregation may be seated.

Reader: A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Acts 17: 22-31

Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, "Athenians, I see how extremely religious you are in every way. For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, 'To an unknown god.' What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. From one ancestor he made all nations to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, so that they would search for God and perhaps grope for him and find him—though indeed he is not far from each one of us. For 'In him we live and move and have our being'; as even some of your own poets have said, 'For we too are his offspring.'

Since we are God's offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold, or silver, or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of mortals. While God has overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent, because he has fixed a day on which he will have the world judged in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed, and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead."

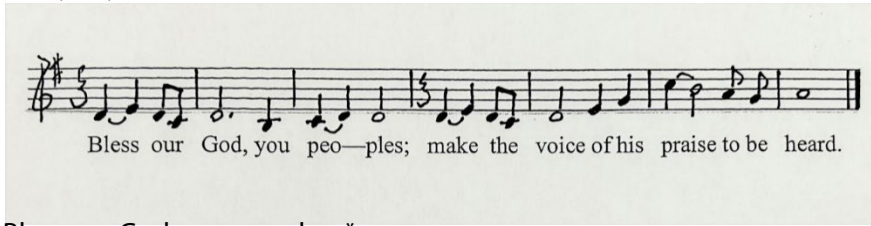

Reader: Give us grace to do your will in all that we undertake;

***People:* That our works may find favor in your sight.**

Reader: Have compassion on those who suffer from any grief or trouble.

***People:* That they may be delivered from their distress.**

Reader: Give to the departed eternal rest, especially Peggy Ferris.

***People:* Let light perpetual shine upon them.**

Reader: We praise you for your saints who have entered into joy;

***People:* May we also come to share in your heavenly kingdom.**

Reader: Let us pray for our own needs and those of others.

We pray especially for those on our Parish Prayer List.

We pray for the unemployed, those in financial distress, for those whose names are on our hearts and minds, and those who are known to God alone.

We pray for the ministry you have given us at Knollwood. We pray for all who participate, that their lives may be blessed.

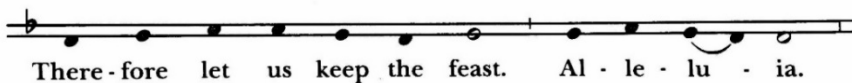

If you are a qualified voter and have not received your ballot, please contact Lois McDonald at lois.mcdonald@allsaintschurch.net.

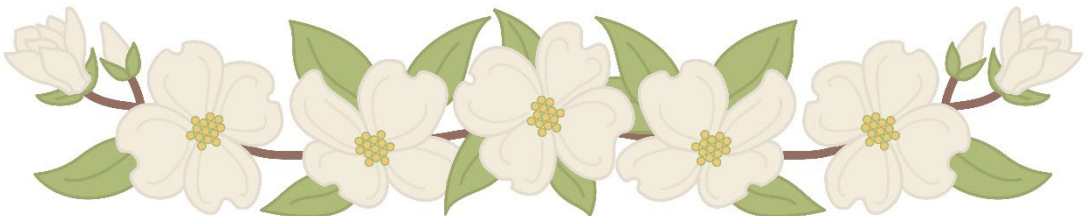
Voter Qualifications


The Episcopal Church requires that you be a Church Member to vote and that all Bylaws criteria be met. The Bylaws require *all* of these four items:

1. Your baptism took place at All Saints or your baptism is otherwise recorded with the parish.
2. You have regularly participated in worship services at All Saints this past year.
3. You are 18 or older.
4. You have been a contributor of record this past year, evidenced by an honored pledge, offering envelope, or other documented giving identification on hand with the Treasurer.
